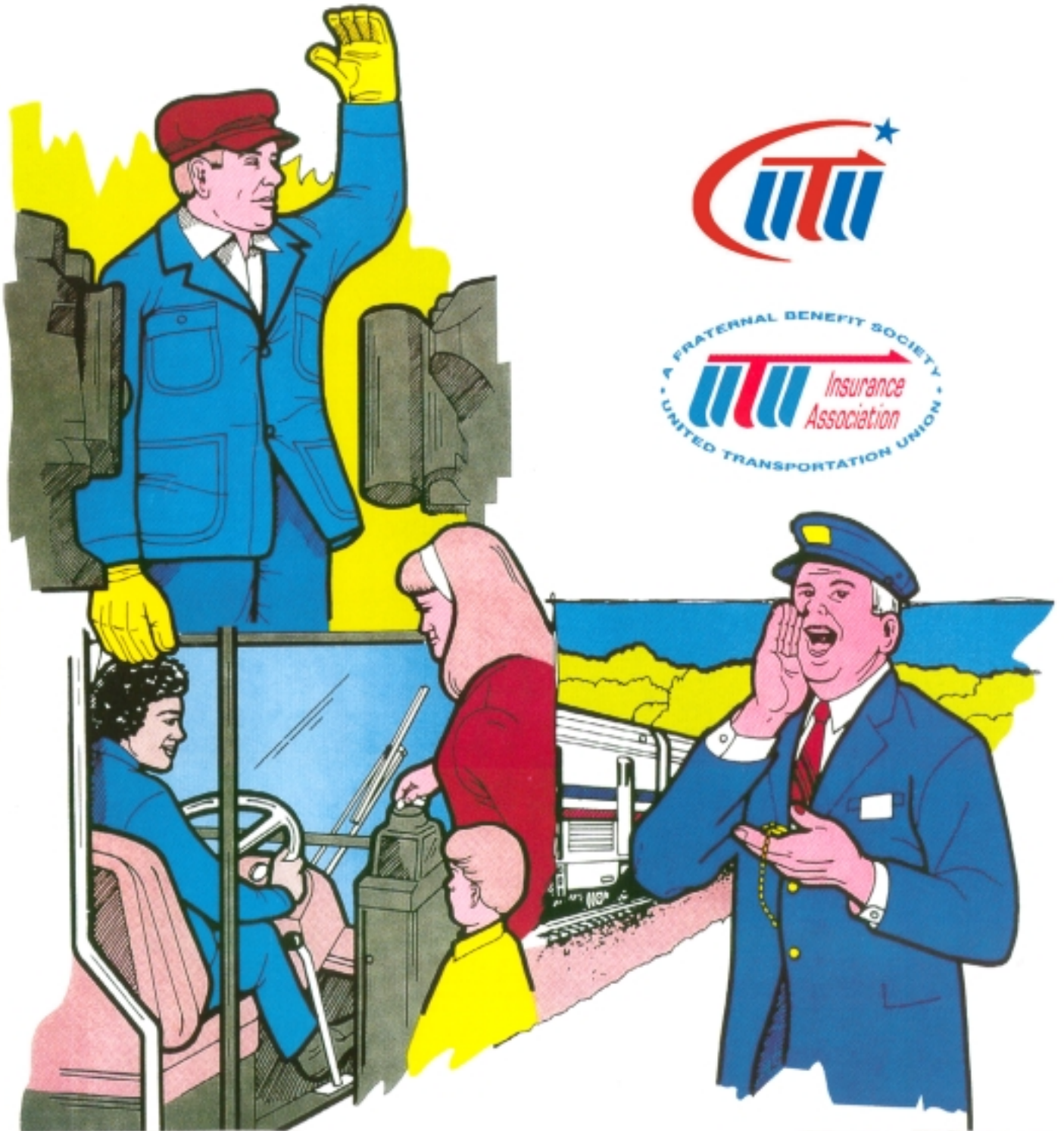

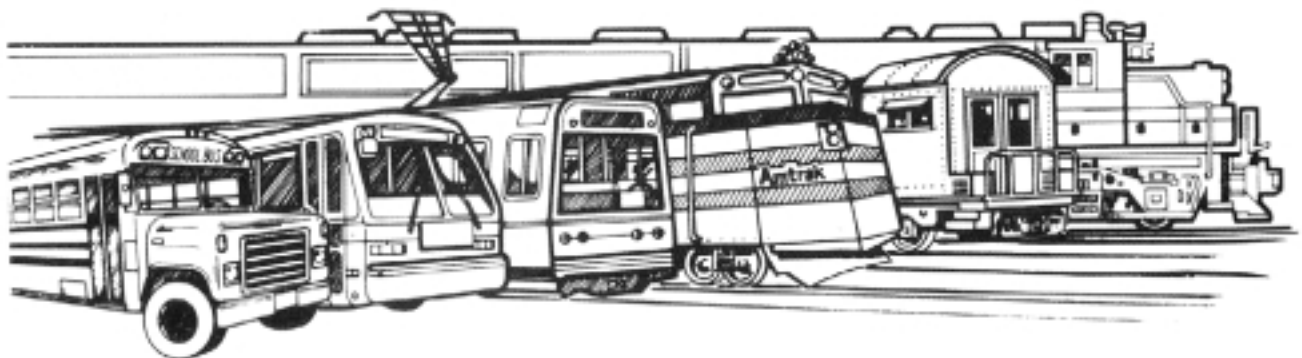
The people who keep the nation's trains and buses moving are people just like your mom or dad, or even your older sister or brother.

This colorful book will help you to know more about these people and what they do. The United Transportation Union is proud to represent them.

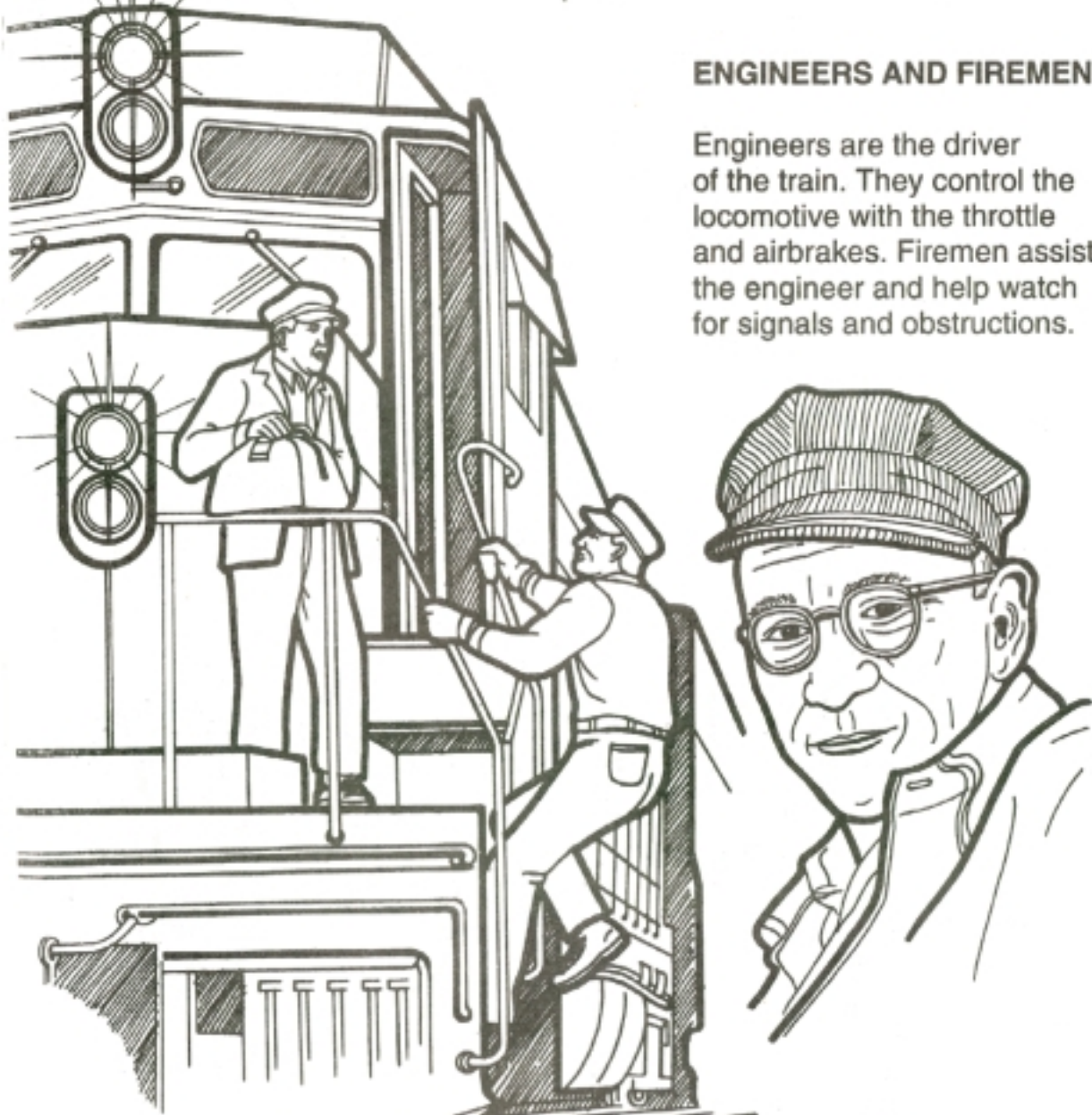

Engineers are the driver of the train. They control the locomotive with the throttle and airbrakes. Firemen assist the engineer and help watch for signals and obstructions.

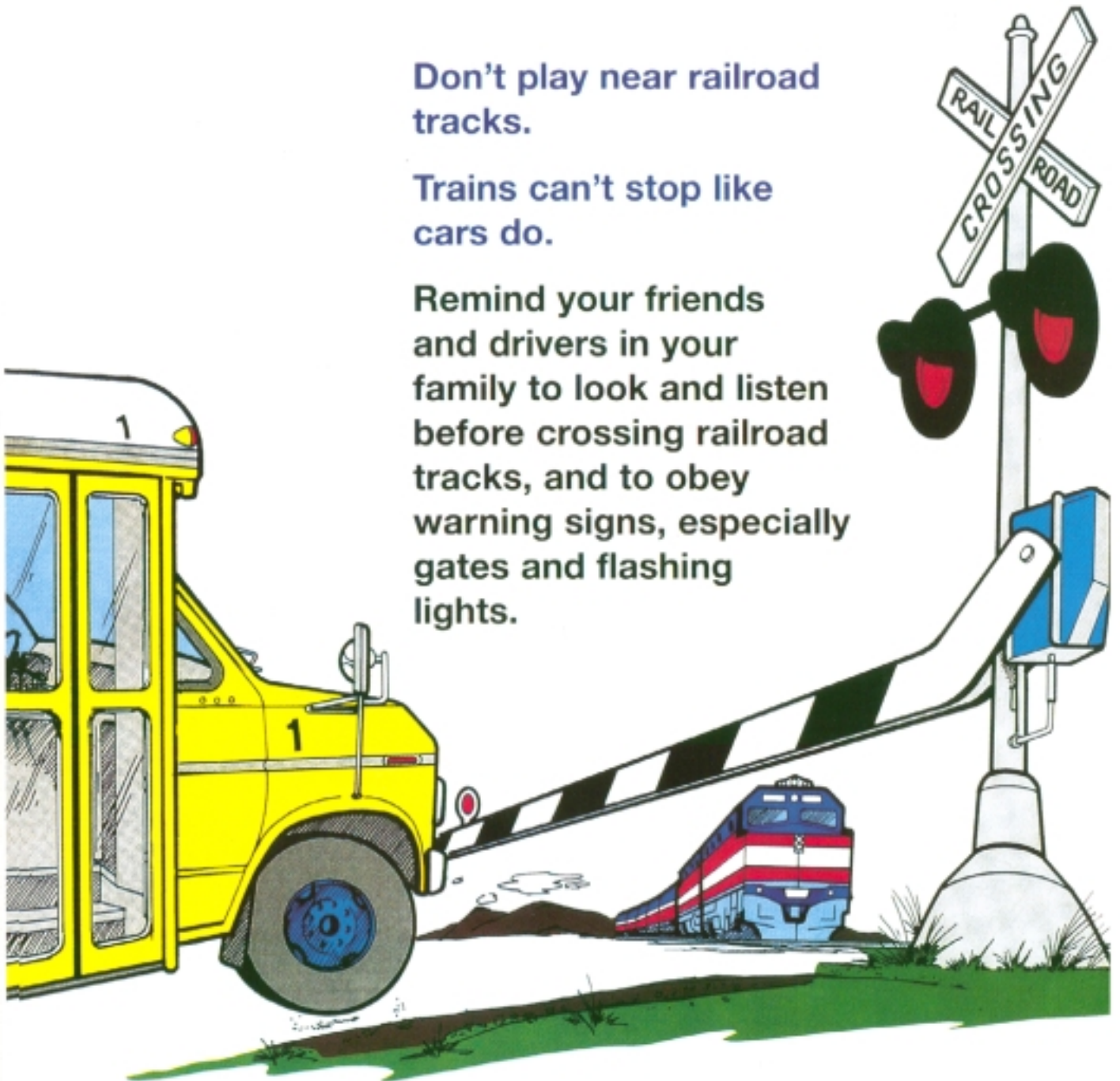


STOP
